



Chaplain's Notes—April, Chaplain Bill Johnson

As you have no doubt noticed there have been many changes in our life styles during the past several months due to the coronavirus epidemic and the resulting quarantine that it is difficult to know where to start. One thing you might have noticed is, about three days ago before Memorial Day, flags were already flying at half-staff in many places like fire stations, schools, Wendy's, National Guard HQ, and many homes. This was to honor the more than 96,000 citizens who have died from the pandemic. Here in the State of Washington there are over 20,000 cases and over 1,100 confirmed deaths and in Pierce County over 1,800 cases and over 75 deaths. If the number of cases and deaths decreased in Pierce County many more businesses would be able to reopen like many other counties statewide.

The churches throughout the country are facing difficult decisions regarding when to restart regular worship services and other programs such as Sunday School and other adult classes with five or more members and how to carry out these ministries safely. In Matthew 22 we read, "You shall love the Lord your God.... and love your neighbor as yourself." During this pandemic love for ourselves is the way we protect ourselves from infection and in that same way love for our neighbor is expressed in a similar manner. Also, during this period of distancing it is important for churches to practice all recognized safety requirements. Our churches encourage us to worship, pray, witness and serve. We must do this in a way as to prevent the risk of virus in our churches.

Above all else don't forget to pray often for your country, your neighbors, your families and yourselves.


