




Commander's Corner:

Chaplain's Notes—April, Chaplain Bill Johnson

Whenever I think of the month of May I remember the family celebrations on Mother's Day when I was young and I also remember my own birthday. What does that possibly have to do with May 2020 AD? I'll let you decide. Up until this time, late April, we know that more than 50,000 people have died in the United States from coronavirus. There have almost 900,000 confirmed cases and so far, some 82,000 have recovered from the infection. These are the basic statistics which relate to the virus and its deadly effects. So, what do we do to reduce the number of potential victims including our family and ourselves? Each of us can carefully follow the strong recommendations that have been developed to reduce the spread of the virus. We must not shake hands or touch another person outside our house.
