Mr. Wigfall joined the Federal Air Marshal Service in January 2002. He assumed the Supervisory Air Marshal in Charge (SAC) position in the Seattle Field Office, May of 2016. Prior to his reassignment to the Seattle Field Office, he was one of two ASACs assigned in the Dallas FAM Field Office where he had oversight of Squad SFAMs, Operations and Liaison Programs. Prior to this assignment he was detailed as the OLE/FAMS Ombudsman to the Office of Civil Right & Liberties/Ombudsman and Traveler Engagement from the Tactical Support Section in Field Operations.

Mr. Wigfall started his FAMS career in the Washington Field Office and was assigned to the Liaison Division and System Operation Control Division/Mission Operation Center. Mr. Wigfall served as an Acting SFAM in Passports and Visas Section and also a MOC Controller

at the Freedom Center in Herndon Virginia. Before becoming the OLE/FAMS Ombudsman, Mr. Wigfall held the position of Diversity Program Manager. Mr. Wigfall started his supervisory career with the FAMS in the Newark Field Office as a Squad SFAM.

Prior to joining the Federal Air Marshal Service, Mr. Wigfall served six years with the United States Capitol Police. He was assigned to the First Responder Unit of the Capitol Division.

Mr. Wigfall holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Sociology with a concentration in Criminal Justice from Bowie State University, Bowie, MD. He also attended graduate school at Bowie State University majoring in Administrative Management: Public Administration.

I want to thank Ed Murphy, Sr. Vice for filling in for me at the September meeting. I knew he would not let the membership down.




