
A firsthand account of World War II alongside one of our US Army's


Chapter Chaplain's Notes—April, Chaplain Bill Johnson



Mother's Day is a celebration honoring the mothers of our families. This year it is celebrated on Sunday the 9th of May. The modern observance of Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1907. In 1908, the U.S. Congress rejected making Mother's Day an official holiday. Joking that they would then have to proclaim a "Mother-in-Law's Day". In 1914 President Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day to be on the second Sunday of May as a national holiday to honor mothers.

In 1949 the Defense Secretary created Armed Forces Day to replace the separate Army, Navy and Air Force days. The single celebration was the result of the unification of the armed forces under one agency, the Defense Department. President Truman praised the creation of the day as vital for the security of nation. President Truman also began Armed Forces Day on Saturday, May 20,1950. This marked the first demonstration of America's progress under the National Security Act which continues to the present time.

Memorial Day originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during WWI when the United States was again in a major conflict the day evolved into remembering American military personnel who died in all wars including WWII, the Viet Nam War, the Korean War and the wars in Iraq and in Afghanistan. Originally Memorial Day was observed on May 30th, but in 1968 Congress passed a law which established the last Monday in May as Memorial Day. The same law also declared



Memorial Day a Federal Holiday. Cities and towns across the United States host Memorial Day parades each year, often including Active-Duty Military as well as members of Veteran's organizations.
