

That picnic is Dennis, his staff, and his residents saying thanks to us for giving them a helping hand over the past year. 11:30 am is the start time and as he did last year our own Bruce Stalk will be there with his musical group to serenade us while we enjoy the food and fellowship. - 1. The Total Cost for NWYLC 2022, for 70 students, was \$40,000, with a cost to the foundation of \$13,000. The cost per student was \$584.00
- Most of the students are on scholarship so donations are needed and greatly appreciated.
