

Commander's Corner: Capt Ed Murphy

I may be going off the deep end on this, but I've been feeling some anxiety lately as I've listened to Dave Gibson present the 'Pershing Minute'. Two meetings ago he described in detail our founder's funeral and when the Minute was over, I was convinced we were about to retire the good General's portrait to our flag closet. When I asked, Dave assured me that he wasn't about to let that happen. But then the very next month (this one) he went back to Pershing's early years. I'm sensing that this may be the death rattle for 'The Minute'.

Anticipating the first question to enter your mind, yes this is a problem. 'Why?' you ask. Well, there are several reasons and, because they're mine I think they're good ones. So here goes:

First, our favorite General Officer doesn't get a lot of publicity. If it weren't for the Pershing Minute, I would know virtually nothing about the man, a real loss, because there is a lot worth knowing. And I'm not just referring to his professional achievements. His values, and the way he lived them out in his personal life (and occasionally didn't) are well worth critical examination. How did the man recover and move on from the deaths of his wife and daughters. How did he stand up to the pressure of the Allied Governments to eviscerate the AEF and make the pieces appendages of the existing British and French Armies. Why did it take so long for him to take a woman back into his life and why did he do it the way that he did. And this is just for starters stimulated, you guessed it, by the Pershing Minute.

Second, the Pershing Minute has been a part of the Puget Sound Chapter meetings since Betty and I began attending nine years ago and, if you must know, it is my favorite part of the meeting, and yes, that includes Gen Dayton's presentations. I do admit that if I had to make a choice between those two it would be a tough one. But more important, the Pershing Minute has become a part of our tradition and is deserving of a fate beyond just being scrubbed from the meeting program. And who can argue that passing out chocolate bars to so called adults, who accept them gleefully for having answered the question correctly, just the way they did back in Mrs. Hooters Third Grade Class, isn't adding a nice touch to a meeting that sometimes needs one.

And finally, there is the matter of the Pershing Minute narrator, Dave Gibson himself, the genuine article, a first-rate storyteller, and as fine a gentleman as you are ever likely to meet. Are we just going to toss him out onto the heap of all his Pershing Minutes? I hope not. Dave's presentations are always finely tuned but more than that they are structured and filled with the detail that only comes from familiarity with the subject, which only comes from the investment of time studying the subject. I'm not sure which, if any of these possibilities, would be best, or if there is still another idea out there that should be considered. I would offer as a next step that, if you enjoy the Pershing Minute as much as I do and you have an idea that might move it forward, share that idea with Dave and let's see where it goes. Seems to me all the past Pershing Minute scripts should be treated not as just a historical file but as a foundation on which to build the next story.

Let me walk with my brother in perfect harmony.


Let peace begin with me, let this be my moment now.

Our goal this year is 1,000 balls.


